

# YetiZone Google Earth Everest Trek Map

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## How to use the YetiZone Google Earth Everest Trek Map

1 - First you must install Google Earth, which is available free from Google.

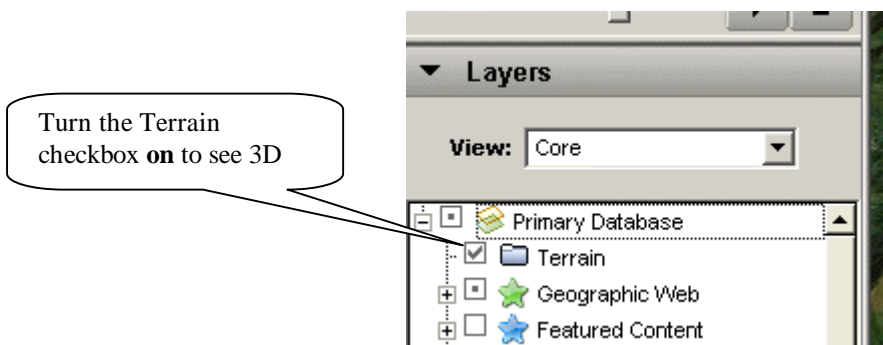
<http://earth.google.com/download-earth.html>

You must also have a broadband connection to run Google Earth.

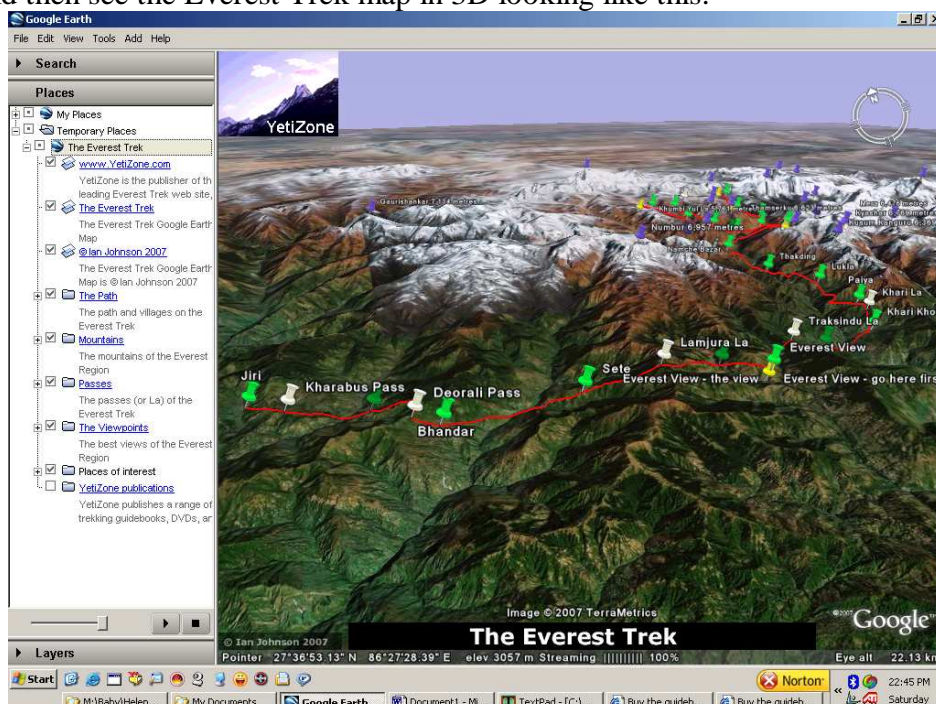
2- Click on the file TheEverestTrek.kml

This will launch The Everest Trek map in Google Earth

3 – In Google Earth, you must turn “Terrain” on by checking the tick box. To do this go to the “Layers” feature bottom left of the Google Earth screen as shown:



4- You should then see the Everest Trek map in 3D looking like this:



The Everest Trek path is shown as a red line. Villages are shown as green pushpins. Passes are shown as white pushpins. The mountain summits are marked by blue pushpins. Yellow pushpins are used for viewpoints. A large “i” is used for places of interest.

The points can be accessed either through the 3D map, or through the menu structure shown below:

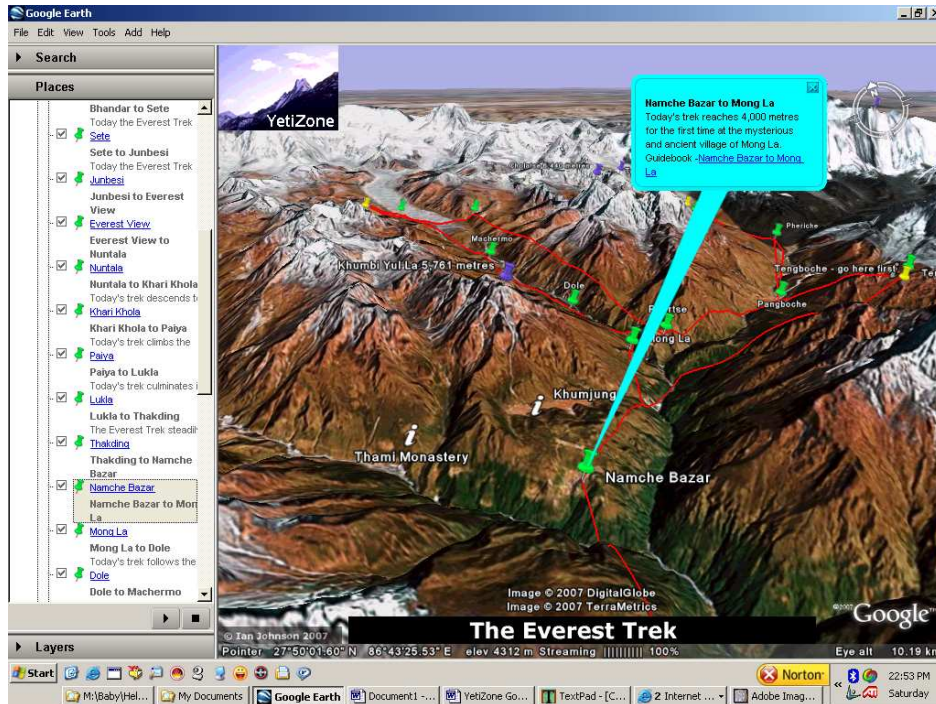
Click on the “+” to see all the villages.

Clicking on the pushpins changes the screen to a suitable viewpoint and displays information. You can click on the pushpins either on the maps, or in the “Places” list to the left.

For instance, clicking on the green pushpin for Namche Bazar, changes the screen to:



You can link through to the YetiZone guidebook web pages from the link at the bottom of the information balloon.

To visit “The Viewpoints” you should note that there are two yellow pins associated with each viewpoint.

- “X - Go here first”
- “X - The View”

To go to the viewpoint you need to first visit the “Go here first” location to avoid crashing into mountains!
